E. NCG Reports

1. NCG Financial Report (Mat) NCG's current account balance is \$1,176.72. Received sponsor funds from two sponsors. 11 members renewed their voluntary membership dues. Treasurer Report received and filed.

1. Neighborhood Schools (Cash)

- a. Miwok: Back to School Night is 8/27
- b. Bancroft: Back to School Night is 8/28
 - i. April planning a garden clean up.
 - ii. 2 parent volunteers will maintain the garden and Bancroft PTO will support as much as possible with marketing, awareness, finances, etc.

2. Neighborhood Sports Leagues (Cash)

- e. BAC Soccer: BAC Soccer season has begun. It kicked off with the Jamboree at Oki Park with friendly scrimmages and food for all players and families.

3. Cabana Club Updates (Mat) Fall hours have begun: Sun 11am-9pm; Mon-Thu 4pm-9pm; Fri/Sat 1pm-10pm.

4. Folsom Boulevard Coalition (Linda)

- a. Development Projects
 - i. 8647 Folsom Blvd- changes made to original application and now has fewer buildings proposed. There would be privacy screens on windows with views to backyards. There would no longer be an offset from neighborhood to building.
 - ii. Nothing new for 8581 Folsom Blvd.
- b. CGNA is working on cleaning up the areas underneath the Watt and Howe overpasses. The state has given jurisdiction to the city for both areas and CGNA is working with the city to place "no parking" signs, as well as "no alcohol" and "no overnight parking" signs.



- c. The Folsom Boulevard Coalition website is now live. sacramentofbc.com. They hope to have more info on activities and proposals on website.
- d. Professor from Sac State is doing demos on his project for the mural on Folsom Blvd.

5. Sacramento Police Department (LT. Todd Bevins)

- a. Homicide by Stingers- suspects in custody within an hour of it happening. 1 passed away, 1 other injured. An argument started at 711. two groups led to a shooting.
- b. Neighborhood statistics: Out of all crime categories, only one category increased this year as compared to last year (homicides)> There were 4 homicides this year and only 2 last year. D7 is down 29% in rapes. Robberies down 16% and burglaries are down 30%. Larceny is down 9% and motor vehicle theft down is down 32%. Last year D7 experienced a spike in shootings but not as many deaths. Conversely, this year's had less shootings but more deaths. Overall, this is on trend with the rest of the city.

6. California Assembly Report (Kevin McCarty Representative)- the backpack update giveaway was a huge success, with about 650 backpacks given away.

7. Sacramento City Council Report (Councilman Eric Guerra Representative)

- a. Their office is currently down 2 people and only has a staff of 2 people.
- b. Speed reduction: It's typically hard for local governments to regulate speed limits. Speed is regulated by the state so no there's no major disparities as people traverse through municipalities. The speed reduction uses a guideline called the 85 percentile rule. If drivers' speeds are above the posted speed by a certain amount, it will be raised or dropped by 5 mph. Now, the city can designate safety corridors and a special exemption makes it easier to change speed. The city traffic engineer evaluates what qualifies as a safety corridor to drop speed limits.
- c. **Homelessness-** A few months ago, the Supreme Court put out a decision that overruled Martin v. Boise grant to pass which makes it easier for local governments to enforce laws for unhoused people. The governor put out an edict instructing state agencies to enforce the decision, so we will start seeing CalSTRS moving people. The city put out an FAQ page on their website.

- a. Community member is starting a local writer's group that's open to anybody interested. Email wingedlion@gmail.com if interested. The group will likely be held on Wednesdays around lunch and will start on 9/25 and last wednesday of the month.
- b. Community member had a question about short-term solution for underneath the Howe underpass.

H. Information Items (*Items not to be voted on*)

1. Food Trucks Recap (Leni) There was no live music this last time. There will be another food truck event on 9/13 and Leni will send out survey soliciting feedback on the food truck events. For the 9/13 event, Leni will invite all different school PTOs or boosters.
2. **Lower Speed Limits (Kristin):** City evaluated whether lower speed limits were needed. Julliard between Folsom and Notre Dame remain the same at 25mph. Folsom Blvd between Alhambra and Elvas was reduced due to proximity of Phoebe Hearst and UC Davis. Elvas Ave was reduced from 40 mph to 35 mph. Fruitridge was also slowed down.
3. **Upcoming Events (Andrea):**
 - a. Food trucks on 9/13.
 - b. Movie night on 9/20 showing Inside Out 2. Starts at dusk at the soccer fields.
 - c. 10/31 Halloween Trunk or Treat. We've had 400-600 kids attend in the past and are ramping up planning to hash out major components of the event.
 - d. Holidays in CG at CMP on 12/8. Will coincide with Sunday book fair at CMP from 10am- 1pm. There will be artisans and crafters selling items, books for sale, photos with Santa, etc.
4. **Folsom Blvd Apartments-** New Design. No additional comments or questions.
5. **Printed newsletter distribution (Leni):** NCG has received good feedback from elderly neighbors regarding printed newsletters. Leni suggests distributing printed newsletters 2 times a year, possibly before elections and before our busy event period. Leni wants to open this possibility up to discussion with the board. Kristin requested more information regarding estimated cost and also suggested talking to CGNA about the number of volunteers they use for their newsletter distribution. NCG has struggled to garner volunteer participation, so this is something to consider. worried about volunteers bc struggling. The board discussed potentially doing printed newsletters for new residents or Leni having



them at open houses. This item will be moved to the September agenda as an action item.

- a. **Movie Night Budget** - \$150 budget for selling candy. Andie motioned for approval. Kristin seconded. All in favor. No dissents. Motion passed.
