Community Events: Embracing Clean Energy and Outdoor Fun

As summer winds down and the back-to-school season begins, our office still has plenty of community events and surprises planned. At our last Tahoe Park Food Truck Night, we partnered with Toyota to host a hydrogen fuel cell demonstration. Food trucks plugged into the fuel cell instead of using noisy, gaspowered generators, showing how clean energy can power local favorites.

The process is simple: oxygen from the air mixes with hydrogen from a tank, creating an electrical current to power equipment. Unlike traditional generators, which release harmful pollutants like nitrous and sulfur oxides, hydrogen fuel

cells produce only water, and they run silently. It's healthier for our community, better for our environment, and a lot more pleasant while enjoying food and music in the park. We're excited to host another demonstration later this year at either Oki Park or Tahoe Park, so stay tuned for details!

Looking ahead, I'm thrilled to share that Movie Night is back at Oki Park on **September 12**. We'll have food trucks, popcorn, and a screening of How to Train Your Dragon (2025). So grab a blanket, bring your family and friends, and enjoy a fun night under the stars together.

What is going on with Real Estate?



If you want to know what's going on with real estate, keep your eye on the interest rates. At the time of writing this article, rates are right around 6.5% for a 30 year mortgage.

Indications are that rates might be slowly coming down a bit

more as 2025 comes to a close. If we see rates come down closer to 6% we should see an uptick in buyer activity and more homes selling.

For now, buyers are picky and indifferent. They really have to be enticed by a beautifully looking home and/or a very appealing list price. Those houses are still selling quickly. But many other homes are sitting as we have been watching days on market increase along with available home inventory. Buyers just aren't going after the not real great homes.

So, if rates stay in the mid 6's we'll continue to see more of that. If they go down, we should see buyer activity pick up.

I'll be continuing to monitor as we transition into fall.
