- **2. Miwok and Umoja MS Reports (Cash)** Miwok started their annual fundraiser with a goal to reach \$15,000.
- 3. **Umoja International Academy (Cash)** Nothing to report at this time.
- 4. Bancroft Elementary Report (Cash) Nothing to report at this time.
- 5. California Montessori Project Report (Andrea) Nothing to report at this time
- 6. Phoebe Hearst Report (Fonda) Annual auction event, The Event, is coming up. The theme is "come sail away." Tickets are on sale. \$70 a ticket or \$130 for a pair. - 7. **CGLL (Kristin)** Opening day was last weekend. The parade was successful and the floats were beautiful. The tee-ball field was named in honor of Pam. NCG is a sponsor of the tee-ball field as well.
- **8. Buzzard Ball Updates (Leni)** Championship games were held last Sunday. Many community members, and fellow student athletes, came out to show their support.
- **9. BAC Updates (Fonda)** Nothing to report at this time.
- 10. Cabana Club Updates (Mat) April 13 the club will open for Spring hours.
- **11. CG Gators Updates (Cash)** Registration has started. April 1 18. New swimmer assessments will be held April 12.
- **12. Folsom Boulevard Coalition (Krisitn)** They meet every third Wednesday at 4 pm.
  - a. Folsom Building Projects A new proposal has been submitted to go in the lot behind the Social Security Building. There is a second apartment complex that will be resubmitting a proposal in the next coming weeks.

- 13. Sacramento Police Department (LT. Zack Eaton) Crimes statistics are looking good since February. The biggest crimes CG is seeing is car break ins and burglaries. Through February, we have received 3% less calls since last year. We are also at a 50% reduction in. (ask him for a copy of his stats he read from his phone.) You can access these monthly reports on the website. They come out approximately a month behind on the website.
  - A. Fonda asked about what happened near Raleys on Saturday night. Lt. Eaton explained it was a pedestrian hit by a vehicle.
  - B. Leni asked about street racing on Folsom Blvd. Lt. Eaton explained that you should call or text 911 to report the street racing and sideshows.
  - C. Ashlee asked if there was a distinction in statistics between vehicle and home burglaries. Lt. Easton explained that there are multiple breakdowns. He suggested that people have motion-sensored lights and video surveillance.
  - D. There have been multiple complaints about street racing and reckless driving. Recently on a rainy day, a police officer saw a vehicle driving recklessly, over 100 miles per hour, in a residential area. The police pursued the vehicle and the police officer ended up crashing into a tree. The vehicle was found to be owned by someone living on Pebble Trail Court. A search warrant was issued. When exercising the warrant, the vehicle involved in the pursuit was found along with narcotics and a "ghost" gun. There is no further information that the police are able to release at this time. Cars cannot be towed based on video evidence. In order for a vehicle to be towed due to reckless driving, it must be witnessed by a police officer. Kristin explained that the police presence at the CGLL opening day was appreciated to deter reckless driving near a busy event.
  - E. MOP asked how the city's projected fiscal budget will affect the number of officers working at a time. Lt. Eaton explained that he is unsure at this time.
- **14. Sacramento City Council Report (Councilmember Eric Guerra Representative)** Will is district director for Eric Guerra's office. He explained that the city of Sacramento no longer paints curbs red by fire hydrants due to maintenance and costs. The proposed city budget is not looking to cut any currently filled positions. Guerra's office is working to have all previous events happen again this year regardless of the budget.
  - A. Sacramento City's YPCE Aquatics Department is hiring lifeguards for the coming season. It is a great summer job. They are also hiring pool management and cashiers.
  - B. City skate camps will be happening at 28th and B. There is a link on the YPCE website and registration is open.

- C. There is a survey currently out to give feedback on the city's budget. This can be accessed on the city's website.
- D. City park plan has an open period for comment. You can access this on the city's website or YPCE's website. Last day to submit is April 8.
- E. Stockton Blvd plan comment period is open on the city's website as well.

- **15. California Assembly Report (Kevin McCarty Representative)** Sabrina, with Assemblymember McCarty's office, stated that the office's bill package is available for viewing. They are currently collecting donations for My Other Sister's House in celebration of Mother's day. There are 17 bin locations placed all throughout Sacramento. Donations will be take through May 6.

  - MOP asked a question about street lights that are not working. Andrea
    deferred to Will with Guerra's office to respond. Will suggests contacting
    311 and reaching out to Eric Guerra's office if it is not being addressed.
    Another MOP stated that she reports through the 311 app regularly and it
    is addressed within a week.
  - 2. MOP asked if NCG has plans to do fundraising. Andrea stated that we do not have any plans in the works. If you have any suggestions or ideas, please reach out to the board. NCG can now do raffles once we submit a raffle application and it is approved. We could not start that process until NCG has existed for a year, which would be this month.
- I. Information Items (Items not to be voted on)
  - 1. Bancroft Garden Cleanup on April 7, 2024 (Andrea) In November NCG worked with a community member to help facilitate a garden cleanup. There are a few items, like irrigation, that the community could not address. Those issues have been brought up to the school district. Due to limited funds, the clean up will be held to help clean up the garden and do what we can to keep the garden functioning. Mary, MOP, explained that most of the deadheading is completed already but there is a high need in weeding and trash pickup. It is best to not rake since that helps the plants with mulch and insulation. The clean up will be from 9 am to 12 pm.
  - 2. Easter Egg Hunt 2024 Budget and Planning Status; Volunteer Needs (Cindi and Ashlee) Cindi explained that we currently have 134 signups

- for the event and we expect that to grow to the event. If you are interested in volunteering, please visit our NCG webpage. Christian explained that the event expenses are currently at \$799.81. All of the event's budget is covered by sponsors. The Easter Bunny has promised to attend the event for photos.

  - i. Walkie Talkies (\$150) Walkie Talkies to be used at events such as the Easter Egg Hunt. Andrea moved to approve the purchase of walkie talkies up to \$150. Mat seconded. All approved.
- **6. Confirmation of election results and new Board Members** Election process has a month long nomination process for the April 2024 to 2025 board. After that process, we have an election process by vote from current NCG members. Marketing representative: Jeremy Burgess. Community-at-Large: Andrea Doria, Ashlee Lopez-Trotter, Mat Schorn, Steven Rogers, Linda Shalee, and Mat Gouge. Parent Representative: Kristin Goree. Business Rep: Leni Lopez-Nguyen. Andrea moved to approve. Christian seconded. All in favor.

- **K.** Adjournment Andrea moved to adjourn at 7:02 pm. Mat seconded.
